## ART & CULTURE



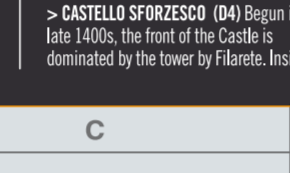
**> DUOMO (ES)** The Duomo is the church which symbolises the city. Entirely built in Gothic marble, the cathedral was begun in 1386 and only finished centuries later in 1966. The imposing structure, decorative sculptures and over 3,400 statues combine with magnificent windows for a dramatic overall effect. This huge and beautiful building is completed with 135 spires and crowned by the great tower topped with the famous Madonnina.



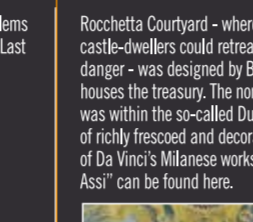
**> THE LAST SUPPER (DS)** After years of work the restoration of this fresco has recently been completed. Da Vinci's



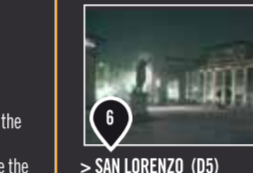
**> PINACOTECA DI BRERA (EA)** This national gallery is among the most famous in the world, containing masterpieces of Italian painting from the 14th to 20th century. These include Piero della Francesca's "Bera Altarpiece", Raphael's "Marriage of the Virgin", the "Lamentation over the Dead Christ" by Andrea Mantegna, Giovanni Bellini's "Pietà", the "Cristo alla Colonna" by Bramante and Caravaggio's "Supper at Emmaus".



**> CASTELLO SFORZESCO (DA)** Begun in the late 1400s, the front of the Castle is dominated by the tower by Filarete. Inside the



Rocchetta Courtyard - where the castle-dwellers could retreat in times of danger - was designed by Bramante, and houses the treasury. The normal residence was within the so-called Ducal Court, a set of richly frescoed and decorated rooms. One of Da Vinci's Milanese works, the "Sala delle Asse" can be found here.



**> SANT'AMBROGIO (DS)** The symbolic basilica of Milan, its history is intertwined that of the city. It was first built in 379AD and consecrated in 387 at the wish of Saint Ambrose, the patron of Milan who became bishop on 7 December 374, a day still celebrated in the Lombard capital. The absolute pinnacle of medieval Roman architecture, the basilica contains magnificent Paleochristian mosaics.



**> SANTA MARIA DELLE GRAZIE (DS)** Built in the late 1400s in the Gothic style, the church was completed by Bramante, who is believed to have rebuilt the enormous apse there. The apse is a classic example of the spacious architecture of the Renaissance, along with another two delightful additions, the Cloister and the Old Sacristy. The attached ancient Dominican convent houses Da Vinci's celebrated "Last Supper" on the refectory wall.



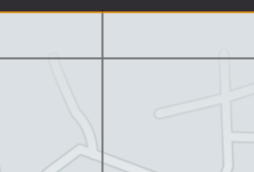
**> SAN LORENZO (DS)**



This is Milan's oldest Roman church (4th century) and is still practically untouched today. The facade, surrounded by 16th century Corinthian columns with a bronze statue of the Emperor Constantine at the centre, is crowned by a majestic eight-spired cupola from the sixteenth century, the largest in Milan. Inside, mosaics date back to the 4th century.



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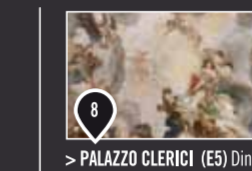
**> SAN LORENZO (DS)**



**> TEATRO ALLA SCALA (ES)** You can have an exclusive evening for up to 1800 guests in the most beautiful theatre in the world, with opera, concerts or ballet from internationally renowned artists. Or hold a more intimate event for up to 200 people with private stages and cocktails in the theatre's smaller spaces.



**> CASTELLO SFORZESCO (DA)** The beautiful Rocchetta courtyard, designed by Bramante was once the last refuge in case of attack. Today it can host medieval banquets for up to 1,000 people, with the option of dramatic shows to follow.



**> PALAZZO CLERICI (ES)** Dining under Tiepolo's frescoed ceilings is a rare privilege for up to 250 guests.



**> ROTONDA DELLA BESANA (FS)** This evocative former church set in a marvelous garden and surrounded by a Baroque portico is ideal for cocktail receptions for up to 1,000 guests.



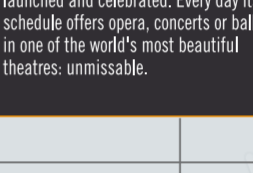
**> PALAZZO REALE (ES)** The home of rulers of Italy like Maria Teresa of Austria, Napoleon and the Savoy family is now a museum rich in history and artworks. The Caposini Room offers an atmospheric banquet for up to 300 people.



**> BREZZA (EA)** This is one of the most exclusive and fashionable quarters of Milan. Narrow streets are crowded with fortune-tellers and ethnic stalls. At night, bars set out tables in the streets and the whole area becomes a single open-air venue.



**> CORSI COMO (AT)** Here you will find some of Milan's best nightclubs, frequented by celebrities from the worlds of showbusiness, fashion and football. Numerous bars and fashion cafes make this one of the busiest areas of Milan by night.



**> NAVIGLI (AT)** This is one of Milan's most appealing areas with characteristic raised apartment blocks facing onto canals, where dozens of traditional old restaurants stand side by side with the city's most fashionable music venues. In the summer, it's all open air.



**> TEATRO ALLA SCALA (AT)** Built in the late 1700s, this is the international temple of classical music where the most famous singers and composers in the world have been launched and celebrated. Every day its schedule offers opera, concerts or ballet in one of the world's most beautiful theatres: unmissable.



**> ISOLA GARIBOLDI QUARTER (AT)** If jazz is your passion there's no better place than this area where dozens of venues host the best European jazz bands.

## SHOPPING

**> The "Fashion Quadrilateral"**  
In this area luxury is celebrated in the boutiques and show-rooms of the world's most prestigious and luxurious brands. Marvellous jewellery from famous designers, clothes and accessories made to thrill, shoes which are true works of art: all can be found in one of Milan's most beautiful districts, filled with historic buildings and amazing internal courtyards.

**> Antiques Market** Milan's antique market is held on the banks of the Navigli canals on the last Sunday of each month. A long, colourful line of stalls is dedicated to antique and modern goods, from furniture to books, stamps and jewellery among many other items.

**> Navigli** This area is the centre of alternative stores and street style, an ideal spot for a special purchase like second hand or unique one-off clothing, hand-made shoes and accessories in the most unusual materials from silk to recycled rubber.
